# February Timelines

**Feb. 1, 1920:** The Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP), colloquially known as The Mounties, (and internally as "The Force") is one of the most recognized of its kind in the world. It is unique in the world as a national, federal, provincial and municipal policing body. The RCMP was formed when the Royal Northwest Mounted Police was merged with the Dominion Police Force. The distinctive Scarlett jackets, midnight blue pants with a yellow stripe and the Stetson style hat have become a national symbol of Canada throughout the world.

**Feb. 6, 1964:** The British and French Governments have announced their commitment to build a tunnel under the English Channel. The project, first proposed by Napoleon 162 years earlier, as an invasion strategy, would take another 30 years before it was officially opened. The tunnel, known generally as the 'Chunnel' is, at 50kl., the longest undersea tunnel in the world. In 1999 it was voted by engineers as the best construction project of the 20<sup>th</sup>. Century.

**Feb. 14, 1954:** In an appearance on the political talk show 'Meet the Press', then Senator John F. Kennedy spoke out against his close friend Senator Joseph McCarthy. Supporting the view of President Eisenhower's position that the McCarthy attacks on politicians and members of the establishment were overly strident and uncalled for.

**Feb. 27, 1988:** Born in East Germany Katerina Witt wins her 2<sup>nd</sup>. Consecutive Olympic Gold Medal in the Ladies singles. Along with Sonja Henie she is the only singles skater to win six consecutive European Championships (1983-1988). Her competitive record makes her one of the most competitive figure skaters of all time.

TEACHER: Now, Simon, tell me frankly, do you say prayers before eating?

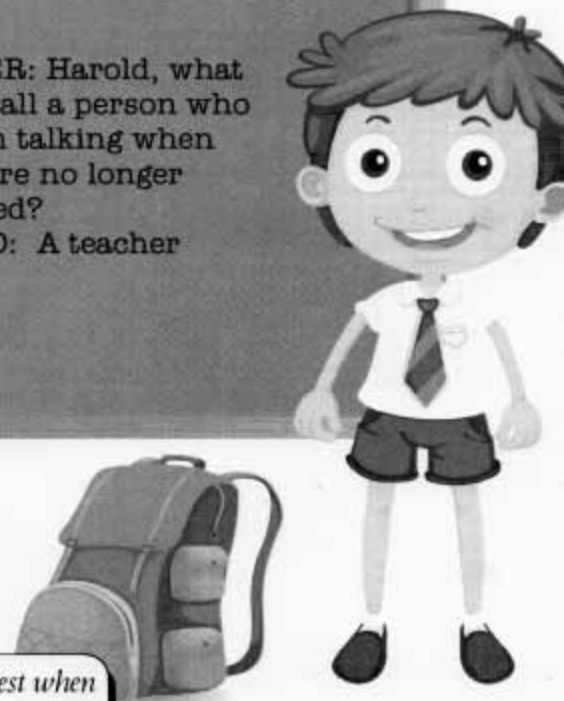
SI MON: No sir, I don't have to, my Mom is a good cook.
